There is so much anticipation and excitement in me since my return this May from the sabbatical community experience in Mysore. Since then, I am into full time parish ministry as the parish priest at All Saints Parish, Albany Creek in the Archdiocese of Brisbane, a different context to find the 'joy of

the gospel' after having spent six years in formation to the first year seminarians in Holy Spirit Provincial Seminary, Brisbane. My new parish is very diverse in its cultural patterns and social structure and is 25 minutes drive from Brisbane city and truly a multi-cultural society. But the COVID-19 pandemic presents many challenges to how we function as a parish community and in light of this public health crisis we face, we are celebrating Mass with 100 parishioners and administer other priestly responsibilities. I am considering COVID-19 pandemic as a window of opportunity for our parish to be a missionary parish. I am aware of the need to challenge myself with my mission and ministry that I have ability to change and energize lives, to restore relationships, to build hope and to build community. Yes, I feel wanted and welcomed here for a mission, to share our God experience to people and to enrich this church with our life and witness.

Rev. Fr Emmanuel Ayankudy CMI

(St Anthony and St Luke's parish, Alexandra Hills

and Capalaba, Brisbane, Australia)

My parish is St Anthony and St. Luke's parish, Alexandra Hills and Capalaba. This parish belongs to the Archdiocese of Brisbane.



I take care of 2 churches, 2 schools and 4 nursing

homes. On weekdays there is 1 Holy Mass across the churches. On weekends I have 4 Masses -2 each for each church. Both churches are 8 kms away



from each other. One of my primary schools is named after St. Anthony of Padua which has 550 students and the other is in St. Luke's name which has 350 students.

Holy Mass: During the weekdays Mass is at 9 am but on Monday it is at 5 pm. On weekends Mass is at 4.30 and 5 pm on Saturday and 7 am and 9 am on Sunday. For weekdays there are around 8 to 20 people and on weekends a total of 360 to 380 (before Covid and now we can have only 200). 9 am Mass is multicultural than other masses. I have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on first Fridays. It was not something people were used to, so I request your prayers so that more people may attend this wonderful devotion filled with the love of God. I conduct meditation on every 3rd Friday, and it is picking up.

Deanery: My deanery is called Redland Bay deanery and there are 6 parishes in the deanery. Now I am the dean of the deanery. There is a Carmelite Cloistered convent in this deanery - one and only in the Archdiocese. There are 15 active ministers in the deanery including priests and permanent deacons.

Sacraments: Amidst the pandemic, abiding with Covid restrictions we could complete the sacramental programme for the children - Confirmation, Communion and Reconciliation. Baptisms take place on every 1st and 3rd Sunday immediately after 9 am Mass, if there is one booked. During the holidays, families will be away and there will not be any baptisms. Apart from the opportunity for individual confession on Sunday's there is a second rite of reconciliation once in 3 months for the whole parish.

Community Life:

Fr Joseph Vattaparampil CMI and Fr Raju Kanjirathinal CMI are 30 minutes away and Fr Josekutty CMI is 45 minutes away from my place. Occasionally we catch up for a community gathering. There was a monthly zoom meeting with

all the CMI's in Australia. We have batch zoom meetings occasionally.

Spiritual Life: Apart from our personal prayer life there are regular one day retreats, annual retreats, and occasional gatherings at the Episcopal office with ministry related workshops. To have a spiritual director and Supervisor (professional counsellor) is mandatory.

Rosary: Usually it is on every Tuesday. In the month of October, we had it on Tuesdays and Fridays and on every Sunday after the Mass. We had a special celebration of the Rosary in the park as a public witnessing.

Administration: There is a pastoral council, finance committee and a liturgy committee to help in my pastoral work. There is Padua Place, low-income social housing, and St. Vincent de Paul society to care for the social needs of the people. I look forward to your prayerful support and thank you.

OUR MISSION AT ARGENTINA

Three of our missionaries serve in the Catholic diocese of Lomas De Zamora, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Rev. Fr Jose Pallattu CMI serves the Catholic Parish Immaculado Corazón de María as the Parish Priest and he serves in two quasi parishes, Capilla Itatí, capilla Santa Rita & oratorio de san expedito at Ntra Sra de Lujan, El Ceibo, Buenos Aires Argentina. Apart from this he is the chaplain of Nuestra Sejora de la Salud convent at El Jaguel. During the hardships of COVID -19, in the year 2020, 350 people received the sacrament of Baptism and 280 people have received the first Holy Communion in the parishes entrusted to the care of Fr Jose.

Rev. Fr Joy Kamugumpally CMI serves as the parish Priest in the Catholic parish Sagrado corazón de Jesús & Nuestra Sellora de san Nicolás and he is the in-charge of five quasi parishes, Capilla Sagrada Familia, Capilla san Cayetano, Capilla san José, Capilla Stella Maris and Capilla Maria at Sagrado Corazon y Monte Grande, Buenos Aires Argentina. 455 people were Baptized, and 162 people have received the first Holy Communion from Fr Joy during the year 2020.

Rev. Fr Shojy Jacob Thekken CMI, who joined Argentina mission in November 2019, is helping both Fr Jose and Fr Joy in administering the sacraments and involving actively in the charismatic prayer gatherings. Fr Shojy could learn Spanish language by now and he is about to get appointed as a parish priest shortly.

NEWS FROM THE CAPITAL

Provincial Auditor's Briefing

Rev. Fr Jinosh Velikkakathu CMI Provincial Auditor, organized his briefing sessions in three levels:

The Provincial Superior and the Provincial department Councillors on September 29, 2020 at 10.00am online. The modalities of the auditing procedures and the schedule for auditing the Provincial departments were announced.

Briefing session to Superiors/Prefects/Directors of the houses/institutions of the province, was held on Saturday October 2020 at 10.00am through online mode.

The Auditor's briefing session for the Financial Administrators, Accountants, and the office staff of the institutions of the province, was organized through online zoom meeting on Saturday 3 October 2020 at 11.00am. The modalities of the auditing procedures and the mandatory preparation required from the institutions during the visit of the Provincial Auditor was explained.

Meeting of the Principals

An online meet of the Principals of institutions under the province, was organized by the Secretary, St Thomas Education Society Mysore, Rev. Fr Suraj K Abraham CMI on Tuesday, 13 October 2020 between 11.30am and 1.00pm. The agenda for the meeting was to discuss about the management of the educational institutions during the COVID crisis. The issues in organizing online and offline classes, disbursement of the salary to the staff, constraints in the fee collection, engaging the student community with creating academic oriented exercises and organizing the faculty development programs etc. were the points of discussion in the meeting. Provincial Superior Rev. Fr. Varghese Kelamparampil CMI moderated the meeting. The provincial councillors and the heads of the educational institutions were present in the meeting and contributed creative suggestions during the discussions.

Animation of Superiors / Prefects / Directors

With reference to the Prior General's circular Ref: PG/248/2020 dated 28 August 2020, we organised an animation program for the Superiors, Prefects and Directors of the houses and institutions of our province through online mode. The online meeting commenced from 15 October and ended on 17 October 2020. The sessions were organised by the Provincial Council, as per the guidance of the General council.

Fr. Dr. Thomas C Mathew CMI, our Prior General delivered the inaugural address. Prof. Dr. Victor Paul (HOD, Dept of Social Work, Christ University, Bengaluru) presented an input session on institutional management techniques. Prof. Glady Jacob (Director, School of Engineering, Christ University, Bengaluru) presented an input session on servant leadership. Rev. Fr. Dr. Varghese Kelamparampil CMI, Provincial Superior addressed the members on the Renewal in religious life in the light of CMI Constitutions and Directory. Rev. Fr Jinosh V M CMI, Provincial Auditor conscientized the members on the topic, Local Administration in the light of CMI Constitutions and Directory. The animation program was concluded with a fruitful sharing session by the members and zero hour, moderated by the Provincial Superior.

Final Session of the VII Ordinary Provincial Synaxis

The third and final session of the VII ordinary Provincial Synaxis was held at Carmel Bhavan, CMI provincial house, Mysuru from 6 to 8 November 2020.

The session was conducted in the online mode due to the COVID -19 restrictions. Before the synaxis



began Fr Provincial and the provincial team, the secretaries of the synaxis, and the fathers and



brothers staying at the Provincial house gathered in the provincial house chapel for a prayer session invoking the blessings of the Almighty for the successful conduct of the synaxis. The session on the first day began at 5.00pm with a short prayer. Provincial Superior, Rev. Fr Dr Varghese Kelamparampil CMI welcomed all the synaxis members to the third session of the ordinary provincial synaxis.

Rev. Fr Thomas Chathamparampil CMI, our Prior General gave the inaugural address. He drew the attention of the synaxis about 42 years of successful growth of the province and its youthfulness. He exhorted the delegates to go ahead in optimism, enthusiasm, and commitment and to set a new normal amid the crises we are likely to face, making special reference to the extraordinary situation we are encountering in the context of COVID 19. The Prior General inspired all the members of the province to be ready for a new normal using our creativity, potentialities, and the innumerable possibilities at our disposal.

The Provincial Superior and the Councillors presented the proposed resolutions and action plans of the respective departments and called for the voice from the floor. The resolutions and action plans for the province were finalised in the session. The mandatory discussions and business sessions

were very fruitful. The delegates from our missions abroad could address the synaxis during the sessions. Rev. Fr Jilson Naduviledath CMI coordinator of the mission in the USA, Rev. Fr Joy Kamugumpally CMI coordinator of the mission in Argentina, Rev. Fr Kurian Kattamkottil CMI coordinator of the mission in Germany and United Kingdom and Rev. Fr Josekutty Vadakkel CMI coordinator of the mission in Australia shared their mission experience with the delegates. Finally, after the completion of all the modalities of the provincial synaxis, Rev. Fr Dr Varghese Kelamparampil CMI Provincial Superior dissolved the third and final session of the VII ordinary Provincial Synaxis.

Training session on Statutory Payments

Rev. Fr Shaiju Narimattathil Councillor for Finance and Agriculture, St Paul's Province Mysuru organised training sessions on the updates of Statutory payments like Employee Provident Fund, Employees' State Insurance and Professional Tax payments. Rev. Fr Abin Baby CMI and Rev. Fr Biju Pallurathil CMI were the resource persons for the training sessions. The office staff of all the education institutions and the Financial Administrators attended the training sessions. The first session was hosted by the Bharath Matha Institutions Koppa on 26 November 2020 and second training session was hosted by Christ Public School Bogadi on 27 November 2020.







CHRISTMAS AND OUR RE-BIRTH

Celebration of Christmas is around. We are all getting ready to have a nother vibrant Christmas celebration. Different from previous years this year's Christmas celebration has the shadow of COVID-19 pandemic on it. Naturally

gatherings will be limited, and midnight celebration may not be so colourful as usual. Still our minds are in the mood of celebration.

Why do we celebrate Christmas? Answer is so simple. Commemoration of the birth of Jesus, our Saviour. This is an answer saved in the memory part of our brain.

The Bible says Jesus' death was an infinite atonement for our sins. (2 Cor 5:21). For our sake he made the sinless one a victim for sin, so that in Him we might become the uprightness of God. He died on the cross as a ransom for our sins (Mt. 20:28). Further St. Paul says "How much more can we be sure therefore that just now that we have been justified by his death, we shall be saved throw him from the retribution of God" (2 Cor.5:9)

Notwithstanding all the exegetical difficulties and multiple interpretations offered by various theologians of different denominations, these biblical passages give us the most simplified understanding of Jesus as our saviour who bought us back from the slavery of sin, by offering his life as a sacrifice on the cross. Then Jesus is the only saviour because he's the only one of the eternal Fathers who paid the price for our Salvation. On every Christmas celebration we should ask ourselves a question, do we fully live up to this reality of our liberation today?

I think in our daily life of Christian living we need to consciously assert the image of Christ as the unique saviour of humanity in the midst of today's growing tendency of syncretism. Jesus being the unique saviour of the entire human race entered into a definite relationship with history as the only mediator between man and God. He is the unique saviour of humanity. He is the only way, truth and life that leads every human being into the Sonship of God the Father.

Today there is a serious concern among the Christians both young and old alike, whether we have diluted this basic fundamental biblical as well as dogmatic principle in the area of theology of religions especially in the multi-religious context of India. While emphasising the fatherhood of God the uniqueness of Christ as the only saviour of humanity was compromised to justify the so-called truth dimensions of other religions by admitting that Christianity is only one among the many ways of salvation. The big question is what was and is the urgency of promoting the so-called truths of other religions.

We made accept and appreciate if there are good values in other religions. This value, in no way can equal the revealed truth in Christ. The uniqueness of Christ as the only saviour of humanity in no way can be compromised for the promotion of pagan values.

Our model and inspiration for such an approach of caution and uncompromised commitment to the father in Jesus Christ as the only saviour is our founder St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara himself. Even before the second Vatican council's liberalised the views of the Catholic approach to other religions, Saint Chavara cultivated a spirit of social solidarity and mature interactive dynamism with the other religions. Establishment of the Sanskrit school, Upavishala and education for women etc. are the examples of this early renaissance under his able leadership which promoted Christian biblical values without compromising the centrality of Christ as the unique saviour of humanity.



Saint Chavara's spiritual orientation and his entire prayer life were oriented towards the centrality of Jesus Christ as the saviour of humanity and he experiences Jesus as the loving "APPA" and looks at Jesus with a childlike desire to have a vision much greater than the present. It may be this intense desire to grow beyond the present that helped Chavara to see through the present and to become a prophetic leader and a visionary of the 19th century Kerala church.

St. Chavara deeply trusted his "APPA" with a deep sense of sorrow and repentance for his sinfulness. St. Chavara in his unique relationship to Jesus as his "APPA" understood creation as an act of God's turning to the creatures by which the whole cosmos, every living being is brought into existence in Jesus Christ, the Word incarnate. God in Jesus Christ turned to creation in order to make the whole universe turn to Him. The state of remaining turned to God is the vocation, purpose and the final fulfillment of human existence and that of the world. The act of turning involves different grades and levels. Union with God and its bliss will depend upon the degree of turning. The most perfect and the eternal paradigm of this turning dynamics is the triune God. The Father is turned to the one whom we call Son. In this act of turning the Father gives totally and fully to the other person. Thus, the son is the replica and the exact imprint of the Father's very being and turning to Humanity to save it (Heb. 1-3) Son is the person who perfectly turned to the father. And the total turning of the father and the son entails the being of the Holy Spirit. (Paul Kalluveettil, "Chavara the dynamic Hermeneut of the word", Herald of the East, Vol.III, No.2, P.370

The very call of men is to turn to God who has turned to him. It involves different dimensions. First of all, he has to turn with his total person. It further demands a turning with the whole human kind as well as with every animate and inanimate being of the universe. When man turns without God to other persons and things- Flora and fauna, and

mineral kingdom- it becomes an irresponsible selfish exploitation of the nature. That is why Amartya Sen rightly said, every process of the development of the world should also take into consideration of the divine dimension of it too. Any manipulation of the nature regardless of its divine dimension amounts to turning away from God and leads to a sinful act. It brings forth in man the feeling of the absence of God as if God has turned away from him. Here comes the concept of punishment. It has a medicinal purpose whereby; God wants to make the turned away man re-turned to Himself. When man is engulfed in the miseries he will naturally cry to the Lord. It induces him to turn back or re-turn to his creator together with the entire creation. God's design for men will be fulfilled only in so far as he could turn to his maker. One's humanness depends upon the degree of his turning to God. The more intense and deep the turning, the more one attains the perfection. Christ is the perfect model of this turning. Then in Jesus, the son of God, man remains turned to the Father totally. Thus, on Christmas he becomes the visible manifestation of the presence of God in the world turned to man to save him from the slavery of sin. (Paul Kalluveettil, P.37-38.)

When man turns to God with the nature around, the very act inculcates in him the virtue of care for the other. This is because God wants from every human being to be caring concerned to the nature and his/her brethren. That is why he is created as a part of the nature itself. Dominating the nature by subjugating it for one's own advantage only is a crime and a sin. St. Chavara's life was an enduring example for the care for the other. Apart from his extraordinary sense of care and concern to the members of the religious community St. Chavara exhibited a unique sense of care for the entire society of his time. It was his unmatchable sense of social solidarity that earned him the undisputed distinction as the religious and social reformer of his time. St. Chavara lived so close to the nature and inspired the religious communities he founded to work with the nature so closely. Carmelite




communities at his time was known for its agrarian engagements and until recently our ashrams maintained that tradition. But sadly, we must admit that such valuable traditions are on the decline today.

Being a man of genuine experience of God and his truth St. Chavara became a genuine servant of the Church and fought against the false shepherds and selfish interests. Thus, he was able to lead the Kerala church in its crisis of heresies and fight for its true identity. As a man who saw tomorrow, he could visualize the needs of a Church in growth, and in fighting against all odds, he could lay the foundation for its journey to the modern era. His efforts in the areas of education, spiritual renewal, and above all the founding of two religious congregations in Kerala for both men and women are the signs of it.

Chavara made his life a celebration of praise and continued turning to God and man. His spirituality can then be better understood as a progressive realization of his baptismal re-birth in the Trinitarian God and realizing his own unity with the Godhead. So, when he calls Jesus as "APPA" he accepts Jesus as his only heavenly Saviour and declares his complete dependence in His providential care. That is why he was able to assert that he did not lose his baptismal purity, that is, his uncontaminated faith in Jesus, at the time of his death. Obviously, it is our personal relationship with Jesus that reveals to our souls the secret of the uniqueness of Jesus as the only Saviour of humanity. This needs a dive into the depths of the ocean of the word of God and for that we should put out our net into the deeper part and let down it for a better catch(Lk.5:4). This going into the deep is our cross and our penance and that is what makes our Christmas more meaningful.

Today as we celebrate another Christmas, we have a few questions to ask to ourselves. First and foremost, do we believe beyond all doubt that Jesus is the only unique Saviour of humanity? Secondly, are we turned to Jesus together with the nature or are we turned only towards the Flora and fauna? Thirdly how caring are we towards the other and the nature?
