MESSAGE FROM THE PROVINCIAL SUPERIOR

One of the most c h allenging questions we face during this Covid-19 crisis is "what is the future of humanity?" We may get thousands of answers except the one we need. Some of the answers we get may be: our future won't be any more



as it was yesterday; life will be more tiresome; government won't support us anymore; running institutions will be a risk task and our search for a secure future will finally end up in one basic question- "How do we live the days ahead?"- a question touches our own very existence. Here too we get multiple answers as for any other questions. But these answers and solutions are limited. To what extent these answers are capable to lead us to a new beginning is again a question for our self – examination.

We can find out an apt solution for all these uncertainties by answering two basic questions:





FOND MEMORIES OF LATE FR. DR. THOMAS VITHAYATHIL CMI

Homily by Fr. Dr. Varghese Koluthara CMI at the funeral ceremony of Late Rev. Fr. Thomas Vithayathil CMI on 15 September 2020 at St. Paul's Carmel Thandavapura.



"I said, never again will I see the Lord in the land of the living.

never again will I look upon man among the inhabitants of the earth... My dwelling, like a shepherd's tent, has been pulled down and removed from me. Like a weaver, you have rolled up my life, and you have cut me off from the loom; from day to night you bring my life to an end. I utter shrill cries like a swallow or crane, I mourn like a dove." (Isaiah 38: 11-14).

I would prefer to place these beautiful quotes from the prophet Isaiah, as the last stutter of our very dear Fr. Thomas Vithayathil CMI. Fr. Thomas who bid farewell to us on 14 September 2020, has set a beautiful example of graceful suffering, peacefully surviving in these days of the COVID-19, even while he was undergoing acute pain due to the bone crushing multiple Myeloma, the bone marrow cancer.

Yesterday his 87-year long life in this world, with 67 years of Consecrated life in the CMI Congregation, and 60 years as a priest, was offered to God, on the day of the Feast of the Assumption of Blessed Virgin Mary, to be with her in the Eternal Bliss of heaven.

I believe that you all will agree with me if I qualify our dear Rev. Fr. Thomas a special and unique



creation of God. We must admit that by his departure one more link of that saintly, ideal religious life is being extinct.

Following the path of Fr. Thomas, whom the family members fondly call 'Pappachan Achan', two of his sisters have also dedicated their lives to God, in the path of Religious commitment, who are the jewels of Vithayathil Family. Moreover, Vithayathil family is a pride of the Syro-Malabar Church.

The Dharmaram College, Bangalore, stands out as the milestone of a new vision of the Kerala Church. If Dharmaram had been dreamt and executed through Bishop Jonas, an illustrious son of Puthenpally Parish of Ernakulam- Angamaly Arch-Eparchy, through our dear Fr. Thomas, another proud son of the same parish of Puthenpally, the depth and width, the beauty and greatness of that same dream has been continued from 1957 till yesterday. He stands apart as a unique and rare link in the history of Dharmaram College and of the CMI Congregation that could never be replaced. Now we realise with deep sorrow, but with an awesome experience that this unique link is being set aside as a great monument in the history of the Church. We miss that connecting link forever.

Fr. Thomas even in his death bed fondly remembered and reminded us that he was one among those seven pioneers sent from SH Seminary Chethipuzha, Kerala, in the year 1957, to study the statuesque statutes and prepare the basic arrangements for the transfer of the Seminary to Dharmaram, Bangalore.

Fr. Thomas pursued a Doctorate from Gregorian University, Rome on the "Little Way" of Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus, popularly known as "The Little Flower". He not only did study the "Little Ways" for academic interest, but also practised 'the little way' in details in his everyday life. I could have the privilege of relating with Fr. Thomas as his student and later as his colleague in Dharmaram. It is with great awe and astonishment that I could watch him, whenever he was free from his classes in Philosophy and Psychology, as a simple, ordinary worker in Dharmaram campus, as a plumber, an electrician, a sound engineer, and at other times as a mechanic of the various

equipment in Dharmaram kitchen, an operator of film shows for Dharmaram community and many more, but always with and for the students of Dharmaram. This "little way", this 'servant style of leadership', was the nature and unique style of our dear Fr. Thomas, that he bequeathed from his noble family.

May be moved by some inner promptings, the very next day after the burial of Rev. Fr. Thomas Kunianthodath CMI at Thandavapura, Fr. Thomas Vithayathil conveyed to the authorities in Dharmaram, that he was sick and terminally ill. I would call those days as the blood-sweating 'Passover days' in his life or the 'good Fridays' of his life.

On July 6, 2020, when Dr. Sait of St. Philomena's Hospital, Bangalore, diagnosed his disease as bone marrow cancer, Fr. Thomas readily accepted it as the will of God. Immediately, he spelt out his firm decision before Rev. Fr. Dr. George Edayadiyil CMI, Rector Dharmaram College that he doesn't need any more hospital treatment, neither biopsy nor oral chemo, rather he would wish to spend his remaining days with his 'Koodappirappukal' in Dharmaram. He was hastening to it. The superiors accepted his wish seriously and affectionately and Rev. Fr. George Edayadiyil CMI, immediately made all arrangements accordingly. He was given the best treatment that we would expect in any good hospital, during this COVID times, along with utmost care of nursing and with utmost love and concern. Dear Rev. Fr. Rector, we the members of Mysore Province, are extremely grateful to you.

Rev. Fr. Mathew Attumkal CMI, the staff member of the Faculty of Philosophy and the head of the Medical Department of Dharmaram College, was so dedicated and sincere in his personal attention to Fr. Thomas, knowing and responding even to the minute respiratory changes of Fr. Thomas. Your service was so unique and exemplary, dear Father Mathew. May the good Lord bless you in abundance.

Pointing towards Bro. Nikhil Thachuparampil CMI, who fondly nursed him, Fr. Thomas Vithayathil exclaimed to me once that 'Bro. Nikhil nurses me and attends to my needs as if a son does to his



father'. Scholastics Sherin, Jerril, Albin, Joseph, Jino, Shebin, Mr. Tony and all others taught us through their committed service an example how should we nurse and attend to our elders. We place on record our deep sentiments of gratitude to each one of you dear brothers, Mr. Tony, and friends.

Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara, our founder taught us that if you look after the elders of your communities, you would be blessed by God the Father. It is a mandate for us, his children, and successors, to follow and practice what he taught us. We proudly acknowledge that our youngsters have set before us a good example of caring the elderly.

Mr. Marcel, the causality-in-charge of St. Philomena's Hospital, has set the room of Fr. Thomas in Dharmaram, in the last days with all possible facilities of a multi-speciality hospital, with love. Then Fr. Thomas prayed to the Lord in tranquillity "Lord, let your servant go in peace'.

Provincial, Rev. Fr. Varghese Kelamparampil, used to visit Fr. Thomas at Dharamaram College, stay with him, pray with him, and celebrate Holy Mass with him when he was undergoing the sufferings with multiple Myeloma. On one such occasion he asked Fr. Thomas, 'Thommachan, shouldn't we go to the Province'? He politely answered, "I have no objection to come to the Province. But I would be happy to stay with my brethren in Dharmaram, for I

do not know how much more my life would prolong." For Fr. Thomas, the loving company of his brethren in Dharmaram was a soothing and consoling medicine than the comfortable stay at the hospital bed, with painkillers and other seductive. Merciful Lord granted that wish of Fr. Thomas too. Because he has been so close to Jesus, his divine Master.

Through the long years of

his life and ministry as Professor, Spiritual Guide, Confessor, serious but considerate and jovial in his relationships, close to everybody but detached from everything as a 'Sthithaprajna', he enjoyed the freedom of religious life, peacefully and beautifully witnessing Christ to all who came in contact with him.

Dear and Reverend Fr. Thomas, being the Provincial of St. Paul's Province Mysore, set a good example of fraternal concern before us, you have established a solid foundation for the financial stability of our province, your simple life style of visiting your brethren even travelling by the public transport buses. You lived a simple and exemplary religious life that would inspire the generations to come. We, the members of the Province pay our loving and respectful homage to you.

Asking God's pardon for our shortcomings towards you, dear Fr. Thomas, praying to God for rewarding you with eternal bliss, and beseeching your loving intercession for the well-being of your beloved Mysore St. Paul's Province, I conclude. May the merciful Lord grant eternal bliss to His loyal son Fr. Thomas and may his soul rest in peace.



COMMEMORATION OF THE DEPARTED


12th Death Anniversary of Late Fr. Amatus Kallarackal CMI

When the parishes were locked down on March 14, there was an ocean of COVID-19, and no place was safe for them. He was getting hundreds of phone calls of the parishioners. Most of them



were asking for prayers for the COVID patients in their families. They did not know what to do, where to go. It was a time of stress. Almost 30 parishioners died of Covid-19. He visited many COVID patients in the nursing homes for giving them the anointing of the sick; He witnessed COVID patients dying; did the funeral service for many of them. God protected Fr. Bejoy from any kind of infections.

After the lock down the parishes were reopened in June 2020. It was a need to do a lot of arrangements for the social distancing for the safety. With the initiative of Fr. Bejoy they did it according to the guidelines of the diocese. People in the parish were happy with the leadership of Fr. Bejoy and they wrote letters to the diocese appreciating him. On 30 August 2020 parishioners offered him a fitting farewell party from the Holy Name of Jesus Church, Valhalla. The parishioners informed the county(district) about how they organised the reopening and practiced social distancing and about the transfer of Fr. Bejoy. The county appreciated and acknowledged his availability as a priest. The county legislature wanted to acknowledge the service done by a young foreign priest to the nation during the Pandemic time. In honour of Fr. Bejoy, the county declared 31 August 2020 as "Fr Bejoy Thomas Day" and they displayed it on the county centre electronic notice board. It was an award, acknowledgement, and recognition for the service of a foreigner during the crisis time of the United State of America. Let us thank God Almighty on behalf of Fr. Bejoy Valliyil for this recognition.






Mentoring


Teacher's Day Celebration

COVED-19 AND OUR HOMECOMING

Human race is going through a difficult and painful period of its history. The covid-19, Natural disasters and increasing threat of nuclear war in the background of escalationships with nations especially in



Asian continent. The aggressive, atheistic and

greedy Chinese communist regime is transforming itself into a coercive and power-crazy villain with its autocratic rulers. The Chinese-doctored corona virus is sweeping the nations of the world one after another taking them to the brink of economic and socio-religious breakdown. Man is looking helpless, even though he reached the pinnacle of scientific and technological advances, at the face of an infuriated nature and an uncontrollable epidemic. Where and what went wrong? Where did human calculations go wrong? If we are looking for an answer to all these, we must go back to our past a bit. We have to evaluate our journey to this point. It is good to think about whether we have ever forgotten the truth that the nature and its goodness are gifts from God.

The Pandemic

The earth has been subject to extreme climate changes for the past several years. Excessive use of biofuels and enormous increase in the emission of greenhouse gases have completely changed the temperature, resulting in severe summers, severe tornadoes, floods and landslides everywhere. We hear all the time that there are significant changes in ocean temperatures and changes in the equilibrium between the oceans and the earth. Michael T klare speaks:

Michael T klare speaks: Climate scientists also speak of "singularities," "non-linear events," and "tipping points" — the sudden and irreversible collapse of vital ecological systems with far-ranging, highly destructive consequences for humanity. Evidence for such tipping points is growing — for example in the unexpectedly rapid melting of the Arctic icecap. In that context, a question naturally arises: Is the coronavirus a stand-alone event, independent of any other megatrends, or does it represent some sort of catastrophic tipping point? (Tomgram: Michael, C. Klare," Avenger planet: Is the COVID-19 pandemic Mother Nature's response to human transgression?".

When we look at history, we can see that cultures themselves have been wiped out by certain natural disasters and epidemics. In such



cases, man often considers it to be the result of the wrath of nature and tries to appease nature by worshiping its powers as gods. Michael. C. Klare writes further:

It is hardly surprising that the survivors of such catastrophes often attributed their misfortunes to the anger of various gods over human excesses and depredations. In the ancient world, sacrifices — even human ones — were considered a necessity to appease such angry spirits. At the onset of the Trojan War, for example, the Greek goddess Artemis, protectress of wild animals, the wilderness, and the moon, stilled the winds needed to propel the Greek fleet to Troy because Agamemnon, its commander, had killed a sacred deer. To appease her and restore the essential winds, Agamemnon felt obliged - or so the poet Homer tells us — to sacrifice his own daughter Iphigenia (the plot line for many a Greek and modern tragedy) (Tomgram: Michael .C. Klare, p.2).

We can accept to some extent that the worship of the forces of nature as gods was the result of man's ignorance. But man has come a long way from this kind of thinking. Man's intellectual growth coupled with rational thinking transformed him from a superstitious magician to a rational scientist in an era of science and technology. For this modern man it goes without saying that it is foolish to worship material objects as gods. The early period of primitive innocence but had one good thing, it was nothing, but they considered nature as the mother and protector of man. Therefore, man was afraid to distort nature.

Back to the past

Later, when philosophers and scientists began to reasonably argue that nature was only a medium to be used for human growth and enjoyment, that is, nature has got only extrinsic value and no intrinsic value, man's attitude toward nature changed. It was started by the sixteenth-century philosopher Rene Descartes who claimed to have discovered the first principle of philosophy beyond all doubt which he phrased as cogito ergo sum which means I think therefore I exist. This created in the western world a dangerous attitude that thinking is the

primary requisite for being a subject and a non-thinking being is mere an object and hence is only having use value. As a result, the aforesaid idea that nature itself has no intrinsic value and only extrinsic value has conquered the world. This attitude not only marked the beginning of the subjugation of the nature with unprecedented scientific and technological advances, but also led to dangerous, violent researches and explosive technological advances that completely ignored nature and its subjective dimensions.

Adam Smith, in the eighteenth century and Karl Marx, in the nineteenth century, portrayed man as an economic animal. A good portion of the world's population accepted it as a new gospel. This materialistic ideology combined with Darwin's theory of survival of the fittest and Marxian communism founded on dialectical materialism and capitalism based on Laissez Faire theory universalized an attitude of acquiring wealth by any means, irrespective of its adverse moral consequences. As a result, man began to think that wealth was the source of all fortunes and dignity. Nature has become a mere object to be exploited by man. Religion and allied thoughts were considered as useless rituals and man began to wander in the magical world of unlimited freedom without realizing the reality of the fast erosion of the soil under his feet. It was too late for human beings to realize the fact that they are left alone into a world of dangerous internal chaos and isolation. Man, who found satisfaction in the world of freedom with uncontrolled inclinations to pleasures, distanced himself from nature and fellow beings. Nature retaliated when modern man, who alternately experimented with different levels of pleasure in frozen flats, broke all the boundaries of moral life in the abominable malls of sexual perversions even to the extent of sleeping with wild beasts. In spite of acquiring the sophisticated medical knowledge of being able to transplant all human organs from head to toe and clone new life in the laboratory, man today is



languishing in the face of death, succumbing to the terrifying diseases created by invisible microbes rapidly undergoing genetic modification and surviving adverse conditions.

Our struggle

We need to see this as a warning to look at the past and move forward. Where did we go wrong? It must be said loudly that the foundation of the morality that the Christian faith has laid for centuries has been shaken somewhere. We made our planet too much humanistic denying the intrinsic value of everything else but man. The new economic sciences, which are rooted only in material growth, and developmental agendas that ignore the unique inter-subjectivity of God, man and nature, have rewritten our moral foundations. Relationships have all become alien to us. That is our greatest curse. As we immersed ourselves in the pleasures of the shores of loneliness, we began to give new definitions to ethics. With the proclamation that Christian morality and Christian moral thought and science lead man to a slave path, the German atheist Fredric Nietzsche declared that God was dead and that man was the world leader who would determine man's destiny, further fuelling materialistic rationalists to portrait moral living and human relationships as signs of weakness. In a world of so-called unlimited freedom where deadly sentiments and diabolic passions flatten their hood, divine truths, religion and religious values and divine institutions were not only criticized and rejected but also were denigrated and trampled on. We have witnessed with tears the many incidents in which the celebrating priest were demoralized and even killed amid the Divine Sacrifice. We have become greater traitors than Judas, who forgot the word of Jesus, that you will never be able to hate me and be my disciple at the same time. Religion and its institutions are converted into platforms for the protection of our selfish interests today.

We have become the victims of atheistic movements in the church that praise God only with

their lips and go out to despise and deny Him. We began to behave as if we are in community recreation centres in the church. We have turned weddings, sacraments, and celebrations into occasions of extravagance, deception, and display of our glory. We have shown great skill in justifying our own mistakes while exaggerating the mistakes of others.

Now what is next? Religiosity is something that needs to be understood a little more deeply than just the sum of rituals and customs. Love, friendship, brotherhood, and an unbroken relationship with God, man, and nature and all fundamental lessons that Christian morality has taught us has to be revisited. For the first time in history, churches had to be closed. It seems that our Lord wants to see this as a call to change, to repent, to come a little closer to man, to God, and to nature, so that we may have the wisdom to respect what is to be respected, and to return to the Word of God. Now we are reminded of the apostle's words that we have a righteous Father in heaven who will reward each one according to his/her deeds. There is a call around us to return to the innocence of faith. A call from a long awaiting Father for the return of His prodigal son. Those whose conscience is not frozen can certainly hear that cry. The question is whether our conscience is so clear to hear the inner cry of the Father, the Paternal agony?

We, the Prodigal Lot

There is a widespread cry in the marketplace that God is a myth and is indifferent to human suffering. And it is further argued that God is more proved to be an ineffective empty concept in this period of Pandemic. If God was any powerful, why did he leave humanity for death and destruction? These questions and discussions are somewhat relevant for those who consider the ultimate goal of life as achieving material and financial security that saves you from death and suffering. I think this is the result of a rather mistaken view of the reality of God as a machine that sits at the top in an unknown



world to distribute favours and punishment to man and that god is an isolated celestial being who is unrelated to the human reality. The truth is that the supernatural is not unrelated to the natural. We need to discover the presence of the supernatural in the natural. All that is worldly and natural are enslaved to diseases, death and decay (Rom. 8: 21) But only when the natural and purely worldly dimensions die the supernatural shines forth. In order to realize and recognize this supernatural we must discern and listen to the Paternal agony and the cry of the Father within us. We are not orphans. "I will not leave you alone" (John. 14:18). The presence of the divine within the heart of the natural and the limited, is to be understood as the suffering co-traveller who always points towards the right direction and inviting us to follow. The tragedy is that man differs with his freedom and embraces the abominable and the perversive guided by the pleasurable and the worldly and hence we became the prodigal lot. The return of the prodigal happens only when man recognizes and accepts that subjective aim which the supernatural invested within us. This happens only when we accept the prodigal within us and repents and return (Luke.15:11-32) A decision which is crucial and more difficult to happen. The period of pandemic, of course, is an invitation to return, instead of subduing exploiting and getting lost in the natural. We must transcend the natural that is subjected to decay and death. This demands an inner realization that what we eat is only suitable for the pig, an animal that is incapacitated to look above and is cursed only to look down. The second step is the start of a journey towards the Father, a journey towards the primordial innocence, towards the solidarity and unity of the creation and the created. A return for a home coming. Like the elder brother of the prodigal son many think that they are within the Fathers home but stands miles away from the heart of the Father. The elder son recognized and aimed only at the wealth of the Father but failed to realize and recognize the love

of the father. He was a prodigal inside the house and hence was not feeling at home within his father's home. We must think seriously to discern whether we are only inside the house as inmates or are we at home as sons and daughters? Until we discern the goodness of the Father, we are only inmates, but the truth is that we are under the canopy of the divine Love. He never excludes us from the shade of his loving umbrella.

An Introspection

What are we searching for so passionately? Is it wealth? power? domination? Did we achieve all what we searched so for in full satisfaction? Or are we able to hold on what we claim to have achieved with so much of pride? Remember whatever we achieve here is only capable of generating neurotic compulsions that enslaves us to the natural to the momentary. It takes a long time to realize that what we eat so deliciously is only suitable to that miserable pig and that realization will be the beginning of our journey back towards the Father's Home. This is a painful homecoming.
